

The Present Perfect

1) something that is just over so that you can see the result
=> Have you broken your leg?

2) for something within a period of time that is not yet over
- today, this year,
=> This year we have had a lot of problems

3) in general you use the present perfect for something that began in the past and has lasted until now
- so far, ever, since, for, recently

=> Wir leben hier seit zwei Jahren.

=> We have been living here for two years.

Past tense we were living here for two years.

I have not met here recently

I saw here only recently

present perfect been (dritte form) der spezial
